


Local 142 Events

TOUR DESCRIPTION:

- Pacific Aviation Museum* See up close the historic warplanes, fighter jets, bombers, battle scars still on the buildings from December 7th and more
- USS Bowfin Museum* Enjoy a narrated audio tour of this National Historic Landmark and her wartime service, explore the world of submarines in the museum and the waterfront memorial
- National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific at Punchbowl Lined with a variety of memorials honoring America's veterans



THE SHOW Te Moana Nui • Tales of the Pacific

In the footsteps of our kupuna (ancestors), Te Moana Nui comes to life through the art of storytelling.

Act I: The Voyage

During a time about the third century while Western boats rarely left the sight of land, our Polynesian ancestors were crisscrossing the South Pacific using their expert skills in ancient navigation. Relying on their knowledge of the sea and sky, wind, stars and waves, they pressed on across thousands of miles across the Pacific and settled hundreds of volcanic islands in Polynesia. The tales of their adventures are told as they encounter battles, hunger, and homesickness, all the while pressing on across the ocean until eventually, they settle their last island home, Hawaii.

Act II: The Life

Peace settled across the Pacific and celebration began. Refined arts and esteemed skills such as fishing and farming began to develop. Celebration and thanksgiving through feasting and song and dance were integral parts of the Polynesian way of life. Featuring the dances from Tahiti, the Atolls of the Cook Islands and Tonga demonstrate the inherent relationships among all of Oceania.

Act III: The Celebration

The ancestors that eventually settled Hawaii, brought with them their customs, and stories through their songs and dances. There are traces of this past all throughout Hawaii's own history. We honor these islands of Hawaii, by celebrating Waikiki, Hawaii's most famous destination. Using the precious art form, the hula, unique only to Hawaii, we tribute the nostalgic elegance, yet contemporary innovative Polynesian dances of Waikiki today. One of the most daring tales of all the Pacific is that of the spectacular Samoan fire knife dance.





INTERACTIVE PRE-SHOW ACTIVITIES

Flower Craft: It is common throughout Polynesia to find great gatherings of people weaving indigenous foliage and flowers into elaborate arrangements. Guests will share in this pastime by creating their own floral hair piece or wristlet; and learn of the significance of the lei and experience its timeless appeal.

Kapa: Otherwise tapa or bark cloth can be found throughout all of Polynesia. To Hawaiians it is a hana no'eau or skilled art that survived extinction and is

being constantly revived. The Hawaiian art of stamping or ohe ka pala can be experienced through making your own bookmark.

Tatau Pasefika (Polynesian Tatoos):

Te Moana Nui (the vast ocean) does not divide, but rather connects the people of Polynesia. One of the many evidences of this can be found in the Polynesian tattoo. Used as a rite of passage to show bravery and maturity, tattoos can be found all throughout the South pacific.

Our Polynesian artisan will draw simple temporary Polynesian designs on willing guests.

Storytelling: The Hawaiians and Polynesians alike had no written form of communication. Their entire history, culture and language were passed on by memory through songs, dances and chants. They had extremely exceptional skills of observation, memory and recitation. We retell some of these stories through casual storytelling and hula.
