SUBJECT: Wisconsin Solidarity Actions on April 4th

DATE: March 8, 2011

Last week, I met with other union Presidents on the AFL-CIO Executive Council in Washington, D.C. where we discussed the attack on union members in Wisconsin and other states. We agreed that these anti-union assaults are a dangerous threat to everyone who works for a living – and especially to all union members. We decided on a plan to mobilize members and allies across the country on Monday, April 4th. I've included some information about the general plan below, but please contact your local Labor Council and/or State Labor Federation to learn more about the action plans in your area. Beating back these anti-union attacks has to be a priority for all of us.
