KEEP OUR COUNTRY MOVING FORWARD - MOBILIZE FOR THE 2012 ELECTIONS

WHEREAS: when Barack Obama took office, the United States was losing about 750,000

jobs a month. The most serious downturn since the 1930s, posed as a real

threat of a systemic collapse of the entire global financial system; and

families are registered to vote and support union-endorsed candidates; and BE

IT FURTHER

RESOLVED: ILWU members are urged to communicate with lawmakers and candidates for

office, demanding action on the critical issues of the day, and demanding

opposition to the anti-worker corporate agenda; and BE IT FINALLY

RESOLVED: this Convention re-affirms the ILWU policy of rank-and-file political action,

based on the principles of independence, education, and mobilization, utilizing

the full range of political action tools as the best way to defend and advance the interests of our membership.
